




UA Earthquake Impact

- Over 60 facilities damaged at UAA and UAF (Anchorage, Eagle River, Mat-Su, Seward)
- Nearly \$4 million in damages
- UAA Anchorage campus closed for five days
- Repairs and monitoring are continuing
- FEMA reimbursement process underway








Substantial Campus Damage


- Boilers offline at 3 residence halls

- Substantial damage to Administration building

Response & Repairs

- Earthquake drill last summer and strong culture of emergency planning
- No student, faculty or staff injuries
- Initial assessments on all buildings complete within 36 hours
- Swift action by facilities maintenance staff – Earthquake on Friday, Campus reopened on Tureday
- Campus open in time for finals and commencement





TOGETHER, WE ARE UNSTOPPABLE.

On November 30, the 7.0 earthquake that struck Alaska forced the University of Alaska Anchorage to close.

Five days later the Anchorage campus reopened. Students completed classwork, took finals and finished the semester on time and on track.
