



Budget was based on the Governor's core tenets:

- Focus on core services
- Expenditures cannot exceed existing revenue
- Maintain and protect our reserves
- Does not take additional funds from Alaskans through taxes or the PFD
- Must be sustainable, predictable, and affordable

FY2020 Operating Budget: Department of Health and Social Services Snapshot (\$ Thousands)

- Alaska Pioneer Homes
 - Alaska Pioneer Homes Payment Assistance \$15,000.0 GF
 - Implement Rates which Cover the Cost of Care while supporting those who cannot pay with financial assistance (\$16,792.4 GF, \$16,386.2 GF/MH)
- Alaska Psychiatric Institute: Organizational Restructuring (\$0.0, PFT -248)
 - To ensure the safety of staff and patients
 - To bring the hospital into rapid compliance with regulatory authorities
 - To prepare the facility to increase its bed capacity to 80 beds by July 1st
- Increase Opioid and Epidemiology Grants in Behavioral Health & Public Health \$10,120.0 Fed
- Retain Youth Probation Services in the Nome Facility and Transfer Detention and Treatment Services to Other Facilities (\$2,000.0 GF)

- Reduce Adult Public Assistance (\$14,700.0 GF)
 - Move to 1983 standard for maintenance of effort calculation
- Reduce Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
 Maintenance of Effort (MOE) (\$16,912.0 GF)
 - Work with federal partners to reduce MOE requirements
- Repeal Hold Harmless Program (\$17,724.7 Other)
 - Provide option to receive dividends through monthly payments to minimize disruption to assistance recipients
- Repeal Senior Benefits Payment Program (\$19,986.1 GF)
- Reduce Public Health Nursing (\$2,000.0 GF)
 - Explore Efficiencies by Leveraging Federal Funding and Piloting Innovative Service Delivery Models with Partners

- Medicaid:
 - Implement Medicaid Services Cost Containment Measures and Reforms (\$225,000.0 GF, \$450,000.0 Fed)
 - Eliminate Adult Dental Medicaid Benefit (\$8,273.6 GF, \$18,730.9 Fed)
 - (\$249,200.0 GF) from status quo projections, inclusive of bullets above
- Statewide Support Executive Branch 50% Travel Reduction (\$353.3 GF)
