



While agencies in the Anchorage area reported the highest volume of incidents (50% of the state total), agencies in Western Alaska reported the highest rate of incidents based on population, 106% higher than the statewide rate.

Both the Anchorage area and Western Alaska have reported incidents higher than the statewide rate.


Addressing Sexual Assault in Rural Alaska

- AST Violent Offenders Unit in Bethel
- Hiring and placement of Sexual Assault Investigator in Bethel District Attorney's office (January 2019)
- Sexual Assault Kit Initiative
 - Sexual Assault Kits in the Alaska State
 Troopers budget, as a line item, exists the
 reimbursement to municipal police
 departments for costs relating to sexual
 assault and sexual abuse of a minor
 cases. This was specifically done for
 smaller departments so that cost is not a
 factor in deciding if an exam is warranted.


- Engagement and completion of multiple research projects in completion of multiple research projects in collaboration with UAA Justice
- Open and transparent data and research focused on domestic violence and sexual assault
- Focused on two main decision points in the criminal process:
 - The decision of police investigation to REFER cases for prosecution and
 - The decision on the part of prosecutors to ACCEPT (or not) cases for prosecution that were referred to them.
- This research addresses, at least in a narrow range, the concerns expressed in a 2018 AFN Resolution (18-11) calling for an investigation of the treatment in the Alaska criminal justice system of cases involving Alaska Native offenders and victims

Statutory Authority

State Troopers

AS 18.65.080

The DPS and each member of the state troopers is charged with the enforcement of all criminal laws of the state, and has the power of a peace office of the state or a municipality and those powers usually and customarily exercised by peace officers.

Each member of the state troopers may prevent crime, pursue and apprehend offenders, obtain legal evidence, institute criminal proceedings, execute any lawful warrant or order of arrest, make an arrest without warrant for a violation of law committed in the presence of the state trooper, and may cooperate with other law enforcement agencies in detecting crime, apprehending criminals, and preserving law and order in the state.

AS 18.65.670

There is created in the DPS a village public safety officer program to assist local governments and villages through nonprofit regional corporations or municipalities to appoint, train, supervise, and retain persons to serve as village public safety officers to administer functions relative to

The protection of life and property in rural areas of the state; and

Providing probation and parole supervision to persons under supervision by communication with and monitoring the activities and progress of these persons at the direction of probation and parole officers.

Rural area means a community with a population of less than 1000 within

An unorganized borough; or

A borough, if the community is not connected by road to Anchorage or Fairbanks




