



### **Approach**

- Follow the fish as they bring new money into the state
  - Commercial fishing income
  - Value added in seafood processing
  - Nonresident spending tied to sport fishing
  - Hatchery operations
  - Tax revenue
- Estimate secondary effects as new money circulates in the economy (IMPLAN)
- 2012 2017 (6-year) average
- Conservative estimate




# Hatchery Funding Sources, 2017












### Alaska Salmon Ex-Vessel Value

## **Commercial Fishing Earnings**

- \$120 million
- Crew share, owner income, expenses, taxes
- \$71 million in labor income (direct)
- \$24 million in additional labor income through multiplier effects
- 8,000 fishermen (permit holders and crew)
  - 1,040 annualized jobs
  - 1,540 annualized jobs including multiplier effects




First Wholesale \$361 million

wild vs. hatchery (common property and cost recovery)







# \$600 Million in Economic Output

Labor income and spending combined

- Tax revenue (annual)
  - \$3.6 million in Fisheries Business Tax
  - \$1.3 Kodiak Island Borough raw fish taxes
  - Sales, property, fuel, and other taxes to communities throughout the state
