Community forum on the State of Alaska Budget

I would like to emphasize that we need to look at several sources of income for the state.

- 1. The oil tax credits need to be eliminated, we should not be bearing the brunt of the cost of oil exploration. The oil companies have adequate income to take care of this part of their business. The price of oil is not high enough for the state to have to pay the oil companies to find new sources. It is a bad investment and we are losing over a billion dollars a year.
- The PFD needs to be capped and the money used to cover basic services. Giving the full amount when it means the kind of loss of necessary government programs is foolish. The bump to our economy is short lived and weak compared to the services the money can provide for the common good.
- 3. A progressive income tax would also be acceptable so the state can fund important programs like transportation, education and health care.
- 4. Cutting these programs also loses the state needed federal funds. It becomes a double cut as we lose 2 sources of funding.

Government is not the inefficient spending program that the governor portrays. The people working for our state and local government care deeply about their communities. They are well versed in saving money and running their offices efficiently. Working for the common good of all Alaskans is what our state government workers do.

The governor also appears to believe that giving money to private industry will be a panacea as it will boost the economy, create jobs and they will regulate themselves to keep our water clean, the air unpolluted and respect other uses to our land and waters. We have enough history to show that this is not necessarily the case. They follow the rules when there is someone there to see that they do. Their motive is profit and keeping water and air healthy is not something they worry about until some disaster happens, then it is too late for the rest of us. Keeping them honest is the job of government and it is a necessary job, not excess regulation that inhibits development. That is a lie that needs to be exposed.

I have heard that upwards of 16,000 jobs will be lost if the governor's budget is approved. If that is correct, it will devastate the state economy, not improve it as the governor declares. We are too small to take such a hit.

I encourage you to do some research on the effects of the budget proposals, particularly the loss of ferry service to coastal communities, education cuts to the K-12 and university and the health of Alaskans as well as the loss of revenue to our clinics and hospitals if the health care cuts are passed. It's only knowing what the human and economic costs of these cuts will be that will give you the understanding that the expenditures are worthwhile and necessary.

I am a teacher Dzantik'i Heeni Middle School. My colleagues and I have watched our class sizes grow every year. My sixth grade classes now average 34 students. My colleague has 46 sixth graders in one class, another has 40, and another has 38. I think most people would agree that those class sizes are too great, sometimes even unmanageable. Even if there are no additional cuts to education, our school still stands to lose two full-time positions next year, due to flat funding, resulting in even larger classes. This as children are transitioning into a larger school during one of the most difficult times of their lives.

Also, due to flat funding the Spanish program at our school stands to be cut. This hurts students as learning a second language is incredibly important. People who learn a second language are more successful and excel in other subjects. It maps children's brains differently. Students in other states and countries are learning a second language, and our students will be less competitive in nationally and worldwide.

Dear Representatives,

I am a 20+ year resident of Alaska, and care about the future of the state.

Many facets of the Governor's proposed budget give me grave concern. In particular:

Cuts to the University System

Colleges are the future. We cannot attract or retain bright young people to the state without them. University administrators have stated that proposed cuts would mean closing UAS and UAA. This would be profoundly negative for Anchorage and Juneau. It also would in the end be a huge waste of wise investment that has gone into these excellent facilities. For me, there is great advantages to having the university as a resource, and I feel there is need for local based research to help us adapt to our changing world. For example, its UAS that is studying the flooding from Mendenhall Glacier, events that could flood my own neighborhood.

Cuts to state jobs

Please note that state jobs and "real" jobs, and the vitality of the economy depends on solid employment options. Also, there is a "critical mass" of number of workers needed to run the state. Cut too much and essential services simply won't be done. In my case, my house co-owner is a state worker. If his job goes, we'd likely sell the house and have to move out of state.

Cuts to Health and Social Services

The state is not going to be able to deal with the opioid crisis without adequate resources. I am concerned about he crime rate rising in my community. I am also concerned that if preventative health options are not available to low income people, it will create problems for the local hospitals. Studies show that is more expensive to treat illness once it becomes an emergency. Finally, a lot of health and social service programs are eligible for very generous federal matches. Not taking advantage of these opportunities is poor fiscal planning indeed.

Grounding of the Alaska Marine Highway System

Transportation is critical infrastructure. Small communities will have trouble surviving without transportation to them. Personally, I use the AMHS both for my work, and for recreation. Not having the ability to readily take my vehicle out of Juneau would certainly impact my life style and work. Projects would likely need to be cancelled in Haines and Skagway.

The proposed budget is short-sighted. We need to invest in our social institutions now to save emergency money being spent in the future. Personally, I am willing to give up a PFD in the short term to have a state and economy and maintain a way of life in the long term. We all want efficient government, but sudden cuts without backup planning is not efficiency.

THE DUNLEAVY BUDGET: MALFEASANCE OR MISFEASANCE?

We often hear politicians saying that we need to "run government like a business". This is particularly true of Conservative politicians. This is what Governor Dunleavy and many of his well-heeled supporters said during the campaign.

I spent 30 years as a development professional assessing and analyzing business cases. Let's take a look at the Governor's Budget from a business analysis perspective.

First, let's understand the context of the business we are analyzing.

It appears to me that the authors of the Alaskan Constitution envisioned the State to be established as a "Beneficial Trust".

I conclude this because this was a key discussion during the Constitutional Convention. In his convention Keynote, Alaska's Delegate to Congress, Bob Bartlett said as much. The Class of Beneficiaries includes the Citizens of Alaska. The Class of Benefits is largely identified in the Constitution. The benefits produced by our "Beneficial Trust" include, among others, Public Education, Public Health, and the Welfare of Alaskans; also the Founders explicitly mention renewable management of Fish and Game, Transportation, a robust system of Local Governments, and a great University System.

My conclusion vis-à-vis "Beneficial Trust" is anchored in the Natural Resources Article of the Constitution, Article VIII Sections 1,2 and 3, which states that the collective ownership of state resources shall be developed "in the public interest" and for the maximum benefit of the people.

So this far-too-brief overview provides context for my analysis. The CEO of Alaska and the Board of Directors are operating a Beneficial Trust for the People of Alaska. So...how are you doing?

The first thing that I notice is that all of the Public Equity Funds—those Trusts and Endowments—are being targeted for liquidation.

What competent CEO of a Beneficial Trust would propose to "sweep" long term assets enjoying a 7% to 8% ROI into a liquidity pool (called UGF) generating <1%? --Especially if the consequence of that liquidation was to terminate the recurring benefits called for in the Charter and By-Laws (i.e., "Constitution") of the business?

When a business—any business—projects a negative Cash-Flow in their operations they will get a clue about what is going on by looking at their Profit-and-Loss. Well...here we have Alaska posting revenue of \$800 Million but offset by current liabilities of \$1.2 Billion! There's the source of the businesses' cash-flow problem.

And, sure enough YOUR legislative analysts have told you that Alaska does not have an expenditure problem, it has a REVENUE problem!

Yet our CEO submitted a budget to the Board of Directors that calls for cutting expenditures, liquidating our beneficial trust funds and completely ignores the revenue side of the ledger.

That is either malfeasance or misfeasance; in either case, it is up to you, our Board of Directors, to save our company.

And for the information of the curmudgeons out there who will be barking at YOU, the legislators, at least in the House side you HAVE done your job—or at least tried to!

Over the past 4 fiscal years you have cut the operating budget by \$4.2 Billion and the Capital Budget by \$1.5 B.

And two years ago, the House coalition came up with an historic fiscal plan that would have had us in the black by 2025—But the Senate (Under Pete Kelly) refused to act on the plan.

So here is what I believe you must do:

Replace the Governor Dunleavy's disruptive train wreck of a proposal with the base budget provided by outgoing Governor Walker. We can't all agree with that budget, but at least it is an actual budget and not a Fake one.

Then you must do the following:

- Temporarily CAP THE PFDs at a billion dollars;
- Institute an income tax:
- Repeal and replace SB 21 with a tax system that benefits Alaska and ends corporate welfare for the largest multinational corporations in the world.

Boom! Job Done. We can all sleep at night again.

Thank you for providing the opportunity to hear my testimony:

Cuts to state services have cause long-term harm to Alaskans. I am here today to ask for your leadership in reversing these cuts and providing a stable economic future for our state.

I am willing to pay for state services with an <u>income tax</u> or with the <u>permanent fund</u>. I think that an income tax would be the fairest way to pay for state services because it would be more progressive and collect funds from those who *work* in Alaska but do not *live* here.

Whether with the permanent fund or an income tax, I am asking for you to fund:
