## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

## STATE OF ALASKA 2019 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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Ana	lysis

The purpose of this legislation is to reduce the number of commercial set net permits on the east side of the Cook Inlet, thereby decreasing the pressure of commercial fishing and allowing for more fish for in-river users. The bill allows for the division of an existing administrative area and establishes a commercial shore set net entry permit buy-back program.
The adoption of this bill would require the Division of Commercial Fisheries to work in coordination with the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission and the Department of Natural Resources. The fiscal impact of this legislations cannot be accurately determined at this time. There would be initial costs to develop regulations and the means of administratively closing areas fished by purchased permits could impact the fiscal scenario in various ways. This fiscal note will be revised when those costs and administrative procedures can be more accurately defined.

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
