FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2019 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB 87

Analysis

This legislation would require the Board of Game (board) to restrict hunting permits to nonresident and nonresident alien hunters when necessary to reasonably satisfy state residents' take of big game, in accordance with sustained yield principles.

Currently, the board has full discretion to allocate hunting opportunities to nonresidents and nonresident aliens through a combination of general seasons, registration permit hunts and drawing permit hunts. SB87 would limit the board's discretion to provide nonresident and nonresident aliens general season hunts whenever the board determines big game hunting by residents is not reasonably satisfied.

This fiscal note presumes the board would be able to make changes to comply with this legislation during their regularly scheduled meetings over the board's three-year cycle and that special board meetings or extended meetings would not be necessary. However, if the board were to receive an inordinate number of proposals as a result of this legislation, the board may need to schedule extra meeting days to work through the proposals. The department feels that this is very unlikely and is submitting a zero fiscal note.
