BILL NO. HB092

Analysis

HB092 requires the Department of Health and Social Services to establish a direct care payment program for medical assistance recipients. As written, the bill requires the department to implement a program within Medicaid for which there is currently no Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) approval mechanism. As such, this note reflects zero fiscal impact until the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services is able to produce guidance to states for the approval and implementation of such a program.
