FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2019 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill amends the crime of theft in the second degree under AS 11.46.130(a) by adding a new section that aggregates crimes if they occur within a period of 180 days, the amount is more than \$750 and less than \$25,000, and the property or services are taken from commercial establishments. The bill also amends statutes related to fraudulent use of an access device to include an identification document, and establishes a new crime of possession of motor vehicle theft tools, a class A misdemeanor.
Passage of this bill is not expected to have a significant impact on the enforcement efforts of the Alaska State Troopers. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is being submitted.
