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## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

## STATE OF ALASKA 2019 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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This bill removes marriage as a defense to certain sex offenses, broadens discretion in managing the registration period for sex offenders and child kidnappers, and closes a jurisdictional loophole that prevented out of state offenders from having to register in Alaska.
The Office of Public Advocacy cannot predict the number of new cases that may be charged as a result of this legislation and whether those charged would be appointed a public advocate. Therefore, the Office of Public Advocacy submits an indeterminate fiscal note subject to review of estimates from the Department of Law on potential caseload increases.

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
