
"An Act relating to electric-assisted bicycles."

- Electric-assisted bicycles not currently defined in statute
- The objective of HB 123 is to:
- » Regulate electric-assisted bicycles as bicycles
- » Update statute to reflect technological advances
- » Bring clarity to consumers and retailers on electric-assisted bicycle laws

Definition of electric-assisted bicycle

A bicycle that is:

- Designed to travel with not more than three wheels in contact with the ground
- Has fully operative pedals for human propulsion
- Is equipped with an electric motor that:
 - has a power output of not more than 750 watts (1 hp)
 - provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling
 - ceases to provide assistance to the rider when the bicycle reaches a speed of 28 miles per hour
