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### STATE OF ALASKA 2019 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

#### Analysis

This legislation modifies the permissible hours of employment for workers under the age of 16 years in Alaska. The legislation also directs the Department of Labor and Workforce Development Commissionner to request from the United States Secretary of Labor a waiver from compliance of more restrictive federal law.

This bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact on the department. The costs to the department related to this legislation should be de minimus and do not require a change to the current proposed budget.
