Analysis

This bill extends employment preferences for veterans to include spouses and dependent children of veterans, former prisoners of war, and deceased service members. It includes definitions of deceased service members, spouses, and dependent children. It does not change current practice or requirements but rather extends it to families.

2 AAC 07.106 would need to be amended to include the spouse or dependent children. This change would need to be approved by the Personnel Board at their meeting following the bill being signed. The Division of Personnel does not anticipate any additional cost due to this change and therefore submits a zero fiscal note.
