

Why the Census matters for Alaska

- Determines federal funding allocations for 70+ local programs in Alaska
- Organizations across sectors rely on accurate census data to make strategic investments



of annual federal funding allocations within Alaska are determined by census data



The census affects all Alaskans.



Dollars

Census data determine funding for everything from public safety and roads to housing and healthcare.



Data


Census data help organizations across the state and across sectors plan and invest.

Threats to an accurate count in 2020

Distrust

- Suspicion of government
- Confidentiality and privacy concerns

Language barriers

- Over 100 languages spoken in Anchorage households
- Census Bureau will only translate into 12 non-English languages (none Alaska Native)

Barriers to connectivity

- 2020 Census will be the first to push online responses







- Take and complete the Census Champion Checklist





More ways to get involved as a legislator and staff

Census Takers will interview household residents and update address lists to collect census data. Census data is important for many reasons, one being because the data collected helps to determine government funds for different programs.
