FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This bill updates and restructures the current sex trafficking and human trafficking statutes. Specifically, it increases penalties for all forms of trafficking, establishes sex trafficking as a sex offense requiring registration as a sex offender upon conviction, establishes the new crime of "patron of a victim of sex trafficking", and establishes a new process for a victim of sex trafficking who has been convicted of prostitution to have that conviction vacated.

Within the Division of Alaska State Troopers (AST), the Alaska Bureau of Investigation (ABI) is responsible for coordinating and conducting major criminal investigations within AST jurisdiction, to include sex trafficking and human trafficking. Should this bill pass, the AST ABI will realign resources to ensure these crimes are actively investigated within existing staffing levels. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is being submitted.
