# FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

# Article 2. Intergovernmental Relations with Tribes.

- 18 Sec. 44.03.100. Recognition of tribes. The state recognizes the special and 19 unique relationship that the United States government has with federally recognized 20 tribes and specifically recognizes the relationship between the United States 21 government and federally recognized tribes in the state. The state recognizes all tribes 22 in the state that are federally recognized under 25 U.S.C. 5130 and 5131. Nothing in 23 this section diminishes the United States government's trust responsibility or other 24 obligations to federally recognized tribes in the state or creates a concurrent trust 25 relationship between the state and federally recognized tribes. In this section, 26 "federally recognized tribe" has the meaning given in AS 23.20.520.
