1 (a) A person who practices medicine, podiatry, or osteopathy, or who practices as a physician assistant or 2 mobile intensive care paramedic, in a tribal health program in this state must be licensed by the board 3 unless they notify the board that they are practicing under another license in accordance with 25 U.S.C. 4 1621t (sec. 221, Indian Health Care Improvement Act). Notice required under this section must be 5 received no later than 14 days after employment at a tribal health program in this state, and must include 6 (1) proof of a current active license in another state; 7 (2) proof of employment by a tribal health program that is operating under an agreement with the 8 federal Indian Health Service under 25 U.S.C. 450 – 458ddd-2 (Indian Self-Determination and Education 9 Assistance Act). (b) A person practicing under the exemption may not practice beyond the scope of the other state license. 10 11 The board requested staff conduct further review of the statutes and regulations to confirm exemption 12 13 for military bases as it was not specifically noted in 12 AAC 40.981. 14 15 The Chair requested the board move to Agenda Item 18. 16 17 **Review of Application Forms** Agenda Item 18 18 19 A. Professional Fitness Questions Dr. Nevhart expressed her concern with current professional fitness questions on the initial application 20 21 form, stating that they are invasive. Dr. Neyhart reported that Alaska had been specifically called out at the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) for the inappropriateness of these questions. 22 23 24 The board reviewed a sampling of professional fitness questions from initial medical applications from 25 Alabama, Delaware, Kansas, Oregon, Washington, and Wisconsin. 26 27 The Chair asked the members of the board to deliberate over the questions overnight and be prepared to 28 readdress the topic on Friday. 29 DHSS Topics 30 Agenda Item 9. Sondra LeClair, Brian Richie, Terry Kadel, and Todd McDowell of the Department of Health and Social 31 32 Services joined the meeting. 33 34 A. POLST Regulations 35 Ms. LeClair, Chief for the State of Alaska Section of Rural and Community Health System 36 presented the Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment (POLST) Program information and 37 proposed form to the board. Ms. LeClair explained the need to provide patients with more choices and 38 improve communication of their needs. The group reviewed the program information and walked 39 through the proposed form. Ms. LeClair explained the intent of the program is a patient driven, 40 voluntary process and that the onus is on the physician to explain options and communicate choices. 41 42 Mr. Mertz asked about altering other legal information. Ms. LeClair confirmed that the POLST form is not intended to change other legal documentation, but that EMTs and paramedic would use for it 43 immediate care. 44 45 46 It was noted that protocol for do not resuscitate orders are subject to approval of the State Medical

47 Board, per AS 13.52.065(b). In following, LeClair requested the board's support of the POLST program.

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Upon a motion duly made by Dr. Clift, seconded by Mr. Olson, and approved unanimously, the Board approved the POLST program and form as presented.

- 4 B. Paramedic Licensure
- 5 Ms. LeClair explained DHSS currently oversees all parts of the emergency medical system, except
- 6 paramedic licensure. Referencing her presentation to the board at their previous meeting, LeClair
- reiterated the focus is to modernize and transform the EMS system, utilizing best practices in Alaska and 7 8 nationwide.
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- 10 Ms. LeClair and Mrs. Jones confirmed both agencies intend for the transfer, if approved, to be a
- collaborative process and a smooth transition for licensees is a high priority. EMS Data Manager Mr. 11 Richey and Terry Kadel, EMS Officer addressed the board's questions regarding the application process 12
- 13 and noted that a lot of the processes are automated.
- 15 Ms. LeClair asked the board to support the concept of moving the paramedics into the EMS office. The Chair recalled Mr. Mertz' request for an independent study to determine if the transfer of paramedic 16 licensure from the State Medical Board to DHSS was advisable. 17
