STATE OF ALASKA 2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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This legislation establishes prevailing wage requirements under the Alaska Wage and Hour Act for 20 occupational categories of "health care provider" and adds requirements for the Department of Labor and Workforce Development to determine the applicable prevailing wages. Enforcement is not expected to have a significant impact on the division and will be absorbed with existing funding authorization.				
Regulations will need to be developed to clarify the prevailing wage determination process. These updates will be combined with planend regulations packages. Labor Standards and Safety does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.				

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
