FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB 290

Analysis

This bill would allow for alternatives to arrest for persons a peace officer believes in good faith is suffering from an acute episode of mental illness. The officer would have the discretion of taking the person to a crisis stabilization center or an evaluation facility or decline to arrest the person.

Law enforcement officers are required to treat citizens equally regardless of where they reside in the state. Therefore they must offer the same alternatives to arrest in situations described in the bill, which may result in travel. The cost of overtime and transportation costs are indeterminate.

Additionally, DPS will need funding support to continue to regularly train officers in crisis intervention and mental health first aid. Currently there is \$80.0 in the Governor's supplemental budget to the Alaska Police Standards Council from the Mental Health Trust Authority Appropriation. That is a one time increment. Ongoing funding after FY21 provided in general funds would be required. The other \$80.0 increment currently in the supplemental for the ALET academy would not be needed again after the implementation.
