





"The students that do not read proficiently by third grade fall further and further behind. As their peers use reading skills to acquire new skills, these students remain on square one."



Grade 4 Reading: Alaska vs. Nation








2017-2019 ELA Proficiency: Grade 3







Not Proficient Grade 3 Students in ELA from 2017-2019







73% of grade 3 students that were not proficient in ELA in 2017 were still not proficient in grade 5 in ELA in 2019.
