This bill would allow for the creation of the Alaska Invasive Species Council to facilitate efforts by the Department of Fish and Game to prevent, manage, and eradicate invasive species in Alaska.
The bill also creates a seat for the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation, or their designee on the council, and allows for telephonic meetings. Serving on this council is not expected to have a material impact on the workload of the Department, or generate travel costs.
The Department of Environmental Conservation's Environmental Health and Water Divisions regularly assist the Department of Fish and Game to respond to invasive species, and this bill as written is not expected to change the operations or workloads for these divisions.
