# COVID-19 UPDATE

#### Coronavirus

To prevent or slow the spread of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19), the State of Alaska issued its first health mandate on March 13 2020. The mandate dictates that all scheduled public school days starting March 16, 2020 through March 27, 2020 will be non-student contact days in which students will not be attending school.

On March 16, 2020, Governor Dunleavy directed all residential boarding school programs to begin the process of returning students to heir home communities. The process of returning students home should be completed by March 27, 2020.

Novel coronavirus (COVID-19) is a new virus that was first detected in China in December 2019. Health experts are concerned because it spreads from person to person and has the potential to cause severe illness. While in some cases illness can be severe and require hospitalization, many individuals infected with novel coronavirus recover by resting, drinking plenty of liquids, and taking pain and fever-reducing medications.

The site serves as a clearinghouse where we share great ideas gleaned from a variety of locations and sources.








#### TIME to plan:

To prevent or slow the spread of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19), the State of Alaska issued its first health. mandate on March 13, 2020. The mandate dictates that all scheduled public school days starting March 16 - 27, 2020, will be non-student contact days during which students will not be attending school. This period of time will allow a statewide, DEED-supported planning and preparatory period during which districts will dedicate the time to fully organizing education plans for remote-delivered education, should the need arise.








