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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This legislation amends the presumption of compensability for firefighters to include emergency medical technicians, paramedics, and peace officers, and to add breast cancer as a covered disease. The Division of Risk Management (DRM) would be financially impacted by this proposed legislation. DRM is funded by inter-agency receipts, based on a shared cost allocation plan. Any increases to DRM operating costs would be passed on via cost allocation to our customer agencies who participate in the state's self-insurance program. The DRM Risk Management Information System does not currently capture any data beyond the workers' compensation claims currently compensable. Due to these diseases not currently covered in statue by the State of Alaska, the information has not been captured for past, current, or potential increase in claim cost. The potential cost increase for this bill as noted would impact the costs for workers compensation as charged out to our customer agencies via the annual cost allocation method. The Department of Transportation & Public Facilities and Department of Public Safety would experience the most increase in workers' compensation for the presumptive diseases within this bill. DRM therefore submits an indeterminate fiscal note.

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
