# Emergency Supplemental Federal Funding for Education



- CARES Act allocates \$30.75 billion to an Education Stabilization Fund to be divided among:
  - Governors (\$3 billion or 9.8%)
  - Higher education (\$14.25 billion or 46.3%)
  - State education agencies for elementary and secondary education (\$13.5 billion or 43.9%)







# Other Education-Related Funding



- \$3.5 billion for the Child Care Development Block Grant - Alaska DHSS
- \$750 million for Head Start Alaska providers
- \$8.8 billion for Child Nutrition programs Alaska DEED
- \$15.5 billion SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) – Alaska DHSS
- \$100 million Project SERV (School Emergency Response to Violence) – *local education agencies*





## Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSERF)



 \$13.5 billion for formula grants distributed to states by Title I, Part A formula

1. U.S. ED

#### 2. DEED

 May reserve 10% for grants and statewide emergency needs, including 0.5% for administration  90% distributed to districts by Title I, Part A formula

3. DISTRICTS







### **ESSERF** for Alaska

- \$38.4 million estimated allocation for Alaska
- 90% distributed to districts by Title I, Part A formula
- Anticipated to become available on April 24, 2020
- Available for obligation through September 30, 2021







# ESSERF: State Level Spending Options



- A State may spend 0.5% of the funds reserved for state level activities for administration
- A State may spend the rest on emergency needs as determined by the state education agency to address issues responding to coronavirus.
  - States can spend the funds directly or through grants and contracts.






# ESSERF: Local Level Spending Options

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- Substantial local authority and discretion:
  - Any activities authorized under ESSA, IDEA, Perkins, McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, Adult Education and Family Literacy Act

- Summer learning
- Etc.
