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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB28

Analysis

The proposed legislation adds commercial fishing vessels (CFV) with a valid commercial fishing license to the list of boats that are exempt from numbering and registration.

The proposed legislation also provides that boats exempt from registration under this section are still subject to titling requirements under AS 05.25.056(a). This will result in no change from current revenue.

This legislation proposes a fee of \$8.00 to be paid annually to the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC) for these vessels, in lieu of paying the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) registration fee of \$24.00 every three years.

DMV collects this revenue every 3-years. Using FY19-FY20 totals, this results in an annual average of \$26,428 in revenue.

This will result in a decrease in revenue collected by DMV as the collection moves from DMV to the CFEC.

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
