FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill amends AS 25.05.301 to remove the requirement for two witnesses to the solemnization of a marriage. Currently, state law requires two witnesses in addition to the person solemnizing the marriage to witness the marriage and sign the marriage certificate. Should this bill pass, only the participants and the person solemnizing the wedding need to be present. The bill may require the Bureau of Vital Statistics to dispose of all current stock of marriage certificates, redesign the standard and decorative forms, and purchase stock of a new form. The cost to the section is nominal. However, the Bureau of Vital Statistics may choose to allow current certificate stock to be used up because the bill does not prohibit witnesses. Future orders of marriage certificates would have witness fields removed. This bill appears to have no impact on public health or the collection of vital records related to marriage. Therefore, there is no programmatic or fiscal impact resulting in a zero dollar fiscal note.
