Analysis

This bill establishes the Naturopathy Advisory Board under the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development and amends or adds to the requirements for licensure, licensure renewals, duties to report, suspension and revocation of licensure, grounds to refuse licensure, services and restrictions a licensed naturopath can provide while practicing, and public health duties.

The bill also requires persons applying for licensure to practice naturopathy, or for licensure renewal applications every six years, to submit fingerprints and fees to the Department of Public Safety under AS 12.62.160 and AS 12.62.400 for a national criminal history background check.

The volume of submissions to the Department of Public Safety for criminal history background checks for licensure and renewals for licensure to practice naturopathy is unknown at this time. Even with a nominal increase in the number of background checks, it is currently believed that DPS can absorb the work with current staffing and therefore a zero fiscal note is submitted.
