Analysis

This bill grants the Commissioner authority to negotiate and execute compacts with federally recognized Tribes in Alaska and to establish an application process for compacting. The process begins when a Tribe submits a resolution and application to the Commissioner to establish a state-tribal education compact school (STEC). Within 90 days of receiving the resolution and application, the Commissioner must convene a meeting with the Tribe's governing body to consider the resolution and application, and to begin negotiations. The bill defines a STEC as a public school of the state, and provides that requirements relating to school district operations under AS 14.16.310 are applicable to STECs. The bill also makes STECs local educational agencies, for purposes of applying for federal funds. Additionally, as public schools of the state, STECs would run through the equalized public school funding formula under AS 14.17.410. Admissions to STECs are not tuition based, with the exception of overage or underage students. STECs are also open to all students, unless there is insufficient space. In that case, priority is given to students who are Tribal members or siblings of students who are already enrolled. The fiscal impact of this legislation cannot be determined without knowing how many tribal organizations would apply, where the schools would be located geographically, and an estimate of student enrollment.
