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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

The Division of Retirement and Benefits (Division) anticipates no fiscal impact to the AlaskaCare employee medical plans, and submits a zero fiscal note.

The self-funded AlaskaCare active employee plan provided under AS 39.30.091 surrendered grandfather status under the Affordable Care Act in January 2017. As a result, the plan currently provides generic contraceptives and - in cases where generics are not available or when a medical exception is granted - therapeutically equivalent brand name medication without member cost share when received through mail order or at a network pharmacy. Members can readily obtain a 90 day fill at either retail locations or through mail order, and extended days supplies can be approved by requesting an override if the member will be unable to access a pharmacy for an extended period of time.

Because the plan already offers the benefits outlined in this legislation, no additional utilization (more contraception being issued) is anticipated as a result of the bill.
