The language in AS 12.25.031 which allows for police officers to use their discretion to take a person suffering from an acute behavioral health crisis to a crisis stabilization center in lieu of arresting them is necessary and fully supported by the APDEA. Additionally, I believe that statute will continue to encourage more resources becoming available to police officers to better assist the community when it is clear that jail is not the appropriate option.

I believe the language in EO 119 eliminating the definition of crisis stabilization center from AS 47.32.900 will have detrimental effects on the Anchorage community.
