2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

The Department of Health and Social Services, Office of Children's Services (OCS) and Division of Juvenile Justice(DJJ) both make reports of missing minors to law enforcement. Under this legislation, the law enforcement agency receiving the information from OCS or DJJ would be required to make the APSIN and NCIC notifications as required by the bill.

The bill will have no fiscal or programmatic impact on the Department of Health and Social Services.
