FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill modifies Alaska Statute (AS) 18.65.620 and AS 47.10.141(a) to require law enforcement agencies to enter missing person records into the Alaska Public Safety Information Network (APSIN) and the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) within two hours of completing a missing person report for persons under the age of 21. It also amends AS 47.10.141(a) to require juvenile missing person reports be entered into APSIN and NCIC and the Missing Persons Information Clearinghouse in accordance with AS 18.65 (two-hours). This change will make state law consistent with federal law.
The Department of Public Safety already trains state and local law enforcement agencies on the more restrictive federal reporting requirement, and most law enforcement agencies already comply with the more restrictive requirement. Programming changes to APSIN have already been made to allow record entry for missing persons under the age of 21 with minimal required information. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is being submitted.
