FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 5

Analysis

This bill amends the crime of sexual abuse of a minor in the first degree under AS 11.41.434(a) and sexual abuse of a minor in the second degree under AS 11.41.436(a) by expanding the elements of each of those crimes to include persons 18 years of age or older who commit the offense against a person between the ages of 13 and 17 years and who are at least ten years younger than the offender.

Changes made to criminal laws can affect the number of people convicted of a crime and/or the length of the term of imprisonment. Consequently, this can affect the number of people incarcerated and/or the amount of time an offender could be incarcerated.

Sexual abuse of a minor in the second degree is a class B sex felony and has an initial presumptive sentencing range of five to 15 years, with a maximum possible sentence of 99 years. Sexual abuse of a minor in the first degree is an unclassified sex felony and has an initial presumptive sentencing range of 20 to 30 years with a maximum possible sentence of 99 years.

Should this bill pass, the Department of Corrections (DOC) could see a fiscal impact of \$320,908 (\$175.84/day x 365 days/year x 5 years) to \$6,353,978 (\$175.84/day x 365 days/year x 99 years) for each person convicted under proposed AS 11.41.436(a)(8) incarcerated under this legislation, and \$1,283,632 (\$175.84/day x 365 days/year x 20 years) to \$6,353,978 (\$175.84/day x 365 days/year x 99 years) for each person convicted under proposed AS 11.41.434(a)(4) incarcerated under this legislation.

DOC cannot quantify the number of offenders this bill would create but anticipates there will be an increase due to the expansion of the elements of these two crimes. Therefore, an indeterminate fiscal note is being submitted.
