# FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act relating to oaths of office; and requiring public officers to read the state
- 2 constitution, the Declaration of Independence, and the United States Constitution."
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- \* **Section 1.** AS 14.12.090 is amended to read:
- 5 Sec. 14.12.090. Oath. School board members, before taking office, shall <u>read</u>
- 6 <u>the Constitution of the State of Alaska, the Declaration of Independence, and the</u>
- 7 Constitution of the United States and take and sign the following oath or
- 8 affirmation: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the
- 9 Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Alaska and that I
- will honestly, faithfully, and impartially discharge my duties as a school board
- 11 member to the best of my ability."

- 13 (c) Each special officer shall carry identification issued by the commissioner
- of public safety and shall carry firearms in the manner the commissioner of public

The oath is filed with the municipal clerk.

Sec. 39.05.040. Oaths for executive officers, boards. The principal executive officer of each department and the member of each board within the state government shall, after reading the Constitution of the State of Alaska, the Declaration of Independence, and the Constitution of the United States, take, sign, and file the oath of office required by the constitution before entering upon the duties of office.

Sec. 39.05.045. Oaths for other employees. A public officer or employee of the state, before entering upon the duties of office, shall <u>read the Constitution of the State of Alaska, the Declaration of Independence, and the Constitution of the United States and take and sign the following oath or affirmation: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Alaska, and that I will faithfully discharge my duties as ....... to the best of my ability."</u>
