Analysis

HB 183 would extend the sunset date and rename the Alaska Criminal Justice Commission to the Alaska Criminal Justice Data Analysis Commission (the Commission). Other changes include: (1) a change to the membership of the Commission; (2) changes to the purpose of the Commission to reflect updates around analysis, research, and appropriation recommendations from the recidivism reduction fund (AS 43.61.010(c)); (3) recommendations for changing criminal sentence practices and criminal justice practices; and (4) conforming changes to other statutes to reflect the name change and the sunset date change.

This bill allows the Commissioner of the Department of Health to vote as a member of the Alaska Criminal Justice Data Analysis Commission.

This bill requires the Department of Health to provide a description for the annual report of state-funded treatment programs designed to promote rehabilitation. The bill also states that the department - in cooperation with the Alaska Criminal Justice Data Analysis Commission - may implement the Recidivism Reduction program under AS 47.38.100(b).

The division does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this bill.
