FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

The bill would create the Alaska Criminal Justice Data Analysis Commission (sec. 3), consisting of 16 members (sec. 4) and staffed by the Alaska Judicial Council (sec. 1). The powers and duties of the Commission include data analysis, research, reports, and studies necessary to understand the functions, operations, and outcomes of the criminal justice system, and submission of an annual report (sec. 5). The Alaska Criminal Justice Data Analysis Commission will receive data from the court system, the Department of Public Safety, the Department of Law, and the Department of Corrections to accomplish its research (sec. 5).
The Judicial Council proposes to use existing resources to staff the Criminal Justice Data Analysis Commission. Judicial Council staff currently supporting the Alaska Criminal Justice Commission will provide the necessary legal and data analysis support, administrative support, web site management, public notices, meeting materials, travel, and public involvement for the Data Analysis Commission. Because the duties of the Data Commission differ somewhat from those of the Criminal Justice Commission, some funding previously appropriated for the Criminal Justice Commission is no longer needed, as shown in this note. The funding to be eliminated corresponds to one part-time position and associated costs.
