











Nonprofit jobs play a key role in regional economies






The gender pay gap still needs our attention: Large nonprofits pay more, but the pay gap is larger

The earnings gap between men and woman is smallest at nonprofits with fewer than 10 employees. However, average wages grow as organizations get bigger, and the pay gap grows with these increased earnings.



Healthcare is still a significant driver of nonprofit employment




Nonprofit employment by sector in 2020, for fields with more than 300 jobs





Nonprofits should be recognized as already doing their part to maximize every dollar to benefit the public. This is a public/nonprofit partnership that must continue.



Delivering essential services in Alaska is business as usual for nonprofits



2019-2020 change


