Analysis

This bill proposes new contribution limits for political campaigns, calls for inflation proofing the new limits by regulation, repeals individual non-resident contribution limits for candidates and political groups, and removes contribution limits for persons contributing to groups that make only independent expenditures and that do not contribute to candidate campaigns.
