## **BILL SUMMARY – WHAT DOES THIS BILL DO?**

Bill Summary:

This bill exempts the requirement for microreactors to only be situated on legislatively designated lands and from requiring departments and agencies to conduct studies concerning changes in laws and regulations, with a view to atomic industrial development.

Bill Analysis:

There are currently no microreactors in Alaska. The timeframe for microreactors coming to market is estimated at five to seven years. Allowing these exemptions will allow microreactors to be situated without the necessity of legislative approval for lands, reducing the burden on atomic industrial development.
