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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

The Division of Retirement and Benefits (Division) does not anticipate any fiscal impact on current operations as result of this legislation.
This legislation requires health care providers and insurers to publicly disclose network pricing agreements and establishes an incentive program to encourage commercially insured individuals to obtain care from lower cost providers by offering individuals and employers a share of the associated savings through a cash payment.
This legislation reserves the regulation of disclosure and reporting of health care services and price information to the state, and unless specifically provided by statute, a municipality may not enact or enforce their own ordinances.
The incentive program and associated provisions in this legislation would not apply to the AlaskaCare health plans administered by the Division. However, the bill requires the Department of Administration to analyze and report to the Legislature the impacts to the AlaskaCare employee health plan of complying with the legislation.
Currently, the Division regularly conducts analyses and prepares reports detailing potential programs and plan design provisions under consideration. Because the Division already routinely undertakes program analysis and report production, those standard practices can provide the basis for the report required by this legislation. Accordingly, the Division anticipates this legislation would have no fiscal impact.

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
