A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

"An Act relating to transportation of students; and requiring that school districts establish a student transportation fund."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 14.09.010(b) is amended to read:

(b) The department shall adopt regulations that provide for oversight of and support to school districts in achieving a safe and cost-effective student transportation system. The regulations must include a requirement for contract terms of not less than three years, if feasible, standardized conditions and bid periods, and standards that ensure cost efficiencies and exclusions. The regulations must require implementation of a bus logistics plan that increases efficiency of school transportation using an airline or other private sector spoke and wheel type of model to reduce multiple individual runs on the same routes and proactive planning of school schedules to ensure maximum efficiency.

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(h) Each school district shall establish a student transportation fund. The fund consists of

- (1) money distributed to the district by the department for the operation of the district's student transportation system in accordance with (a) of this section;
- (2) gifts, bequests, contributions from other sources, and federal money received for the operation of the district's student transportation system; and
 - (3) other money deposited in the fund by the district.
- (i) A school district shall separately account for money received under (h)(1) of this section. A school district shall maintain complete financial records of the receipt, transfer, and expenditure of money deposited in the fund under (h)(1) of this section. The records must be in the form required by the department and are subject to audit by the department at a time and place designated by the department. Except as provided in (e) of this section, a school district may transfer and expend money received under (h)(1) of this section only for the operation of the district's student transportation system.
- (j) The department shall review each school district's annual audit under AS 14.14.050 for the preceding fiscal year to ascertain the year-end balance of the school district's student transportation fund. Each fiscal year, the state shall deduct from the state aid that would otherwise be paid to a school district for the operation of the district's student transportation system an amount equal to one-half of the unreserved portion of the district's year-end student transportation fund balance.
