FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 265

Analysis

HB 265 will allow qualified health care providers outside Alaska who do not hold an Alaska license to practice telehealth if referred by an Alaska-licensed provider. It also clarifies parameters of telehealth prescription of a controlled substance and diagnosis of opioid use disorder by certain licensed providers.

If the bill passes, the following expenses will be incurred by the Division of Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing:

Services: \$14.7 (legal costs to amend regulations, printing, and postage in first year)

Professional licensing programs within the Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing are primarily funded by Receipt Supported Services, fund source 1156 Rcpt Svcs (DGF). Licensing fees for each occupation are set per AS 08.01.065 so the total amount of revenue collected approximately equals the occupation's actual regulatory costs.
