- Grants to Non-Profits to Offset Revenue Loss: \$20 million
 - Administered by Alaska Community Foundation on behalf of the department
 - Designed to be administered in two tranches
 - 99 awards were made to nonprofits in round one, granting a total of \$10.8 million
 - Round two applications close February 16, 2022

Grant Review Panel:

Alaska Community Foundation, Alaska Housing Finance Corporation, Alaska Mental Health Authority, Mat-Su Health Foundation, Bethel Community Services Foundation, Bristol Bay Native Corporation Education Foundation, Doyon Limited, Sealaska, the Rasmuson Foundation, and the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development

- Grants to Tourism and Other Businesses: \$90 million
 - Managed through a contracted program operator (Juneau Economic Development Council)
 - Demonstrated 50 percent net-income loss after including all local, State, or federal relief required to qualify
 - Grant amounts of 80 percent of demonstrated loss up to tier-based cap
 - Applications were accepted September 17, 2021 to October 19, 2021
 - 363 grants approved totaling \$45.9 million

- Grants to Local Governments: \$50 million
 - Managed by the Division of Community and Regional Affairs
 - Relief for local governments that experienced qualifying revenue loss due to Covid-19
 - Application period open from November 5, 2021 to December 6, 2021
 - 41 qualifying applications received with demonstrated revenue losses in a range of 10 to
 70 percent
 - Total demonstrated loss: \$130.9 million
 - Award notifications anticipated in the first week of February

- Grants to Electrical Utilities: \$7 million
 - Managed by the Alaska Energy Authority
 - Application period ran October 22, 2021 to November 22, 2021
 - Review of applications and disbursement of funds is underway
 - 35 applications received requesting \$4.9 million
 - 18 applications disbursed
 - 10 applications still under review
 - 7 applications approved pending disbursement

- Economic Development Planning Activities: \$1 million
 - Federal funding from the Economic Development Administration
 - Grant process to receive funds is underway
- Federal Relief For State Tourism: \$10 million
 - The Alaska Travel Industry Association was named the designated entity to apply for this funding and the authority will be restricted
- Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute: \$7 million
 - Trade promotion funding to support seafood marketing
- Grants to Non-Entitlement Units: \$185 million
 - Non-Units of General Local Government (Non-UGLG) Census Area Funding: \$14.9 million
 - Non-Entitlement Units (NEU) Cities: \$43.2 million
 - Remainder of funding is direct to boroughs / metropolitan cities; balance will be restricted



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
