FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill amends the sexual abuse of a minor statutes by criminalizing conduct that is currently legal. The bill makes sexual conduct between a person who is 16 or 17 years old and a person who is at least 10 years older than the victim sexual abuse of a minor in the first degree (an unclassified felony) if the conduct involves penetration, and sexual abuse of a minor in the second degree (a class B sexual felony) if the conduct involves sexual contact.

This change will result in an increase in the number of sexual abuse of a minor cases reported to the Alaska State Troopers and a significant workload increase for the Department of Public Safety along with the commensurate costs.

It is estimated that DPS will need a total of seven new commissioned positions; one each in Anchorage, Wasilla, Kenai, Fairbanks, Bethel, Nome, and Kotzebue.

Felony investigations, particularly unclassified felonies such as first degree sexual abuse of a minor, are time and resource intensive. Felony investigations can span weeks or months. Case officers also participate in the prosecution process and attend sometimes weeks' worth of trial testimony, making that trooper unavailable to complete other investigative work. Even one or two additional investigations a month per listed region will result the need for an additional trooper to take on those investigations. The changes proposed by this bill will also require extensive retraining of all law enforcement officers in Alaska.

First year annual costs include:

- Personal services costs totaling \$1,589,100 for four permanent full time (PFT) State Trooper Investigator positions, three PFT State Trooper positions, and overtime costs to retrain existing State Troopers, Investigators, and Sergeants;
- Travel costs totaling \$177,200 including field visits and training, relocation, and twelve two-day trainings to retrain commissioned staff;
- Contractual costs of \$348,200 including vehicle costs and fuel, training, telecommunications, and new hire testing such as physical exams, psychological testing, and polygraph examinations;
- Supply costs of \$85,400 including consumables such as a computer, uniform, and ammunition; and
- Capital outlay costs totaling \$514,800 including the cost of new vehicles, vehicle upfit of equipment, radars, portable radios, firearms, and ballistic gear.

Second and subsequent years costs are estimated at \$2,212,300 and includes annual personal services costs for the seven new positions and annual costs for travel, contractual, supplies, and capital outlay. This allows for ongoing investigations, training, and replenishment of consumables.
