Dear Speaker Stutes:

Under the authority of Article III, Section 18, of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill allowing the Rampart School to become part of the Yukon Koyukuk School District (YKSD).

The Rampart School is currently part of the Yukon Flats School District (YFSD). However, by mutual agreement, the YKSD has administered and operated the Rampart School for several years. The community of Rampart is culturally and historically aligned with the communities in the YKSD, and both school districts support placing the Rampart School in the YKSD.

This legislation allows for maximum local participation with the YKSD School Board. Currently, parents of children at the Rampart School cannot participate in YKSD School Board elections. The proposed legislation will result in a boundary change between the two regional educational attendance areas (REAAs) thereby allowing parents of the Rampart School to participate in school board elections applicable to their community school.

REAAs are part of the unorganized borough. Pursuant to Article X, Section 6 of the Alaska Constitution, the legislature serves as the assembly for the unorganized borough. Accordingly, the legislature is the appropriate entity to authorize allowing the Rampart School to become part of the YKSD.

I urge your prompt and favorable action on this measure.

Whereas, the Rampart Village Council has requested that the Rampart School be moved from the Yukon Flats School District (YFSD) to the Yukon-Koyukuk School District (YKSD), and

Whereas, the responsibility for schools within REAA's is set out in AS 14.08.041 as follows:

(a) A regional educational attendance area shall be operated on an areawide basis under the management and control of a regional school board.

Whereas, AS 14.08101 (2) authorizes the YFSD to contract with YKSD to provide educational services to the K-12 population in Rampart, and

Whereas, pursuant to AS 14.14.110 such cooperation between YFSD and YKSD is expressly allowed, and

NOW THEREFORE, YFSD, YKSD, the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) and the Alaska Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development (DCCED) agree as follows:

- 1. Rampart School will be administered and operated by YKSD on behalf of YFSD for the entire 2017-18 school year and subsequent years as discussed in item 9 below.
- 2. That obligation in numbered paragraph above includes all of the state and federal educational laws and regulations, as well as any other relevant statutory or regulatory requirements. Those obligations include, but are not limited to, the providing of required special education services, student assessments, student testing, graduation credits, and the employment of certified and classified staff.
- 3. Students in Rampart completing their high school graduation requirements during the term of this Agreement shall receive the requisite diploma from YKSD.

- 4. That obligation above includes the provision of internet access or other instructional technology services deemed appropriate by YKSD.
- 5. That obligation above includes whatever agreements/leases/or other contracts are required between YKSD and the Rampart Village Council for school and teacher housing facilities, and their maintenance, insurance and utilities.
- 6. Other than the execution of this Agreement, or as set forth in this agreement, no funding, payment, or other obligations and responsibilities are assumed by YFSD pursuant to this Agreement.
- DEED agrees that YKSD may account the Rampart students as its own for purposes of the 20 day count and educational funding pursuant to the foundation formula or other applicable funding programs.
- 8. The parties agree to cooperate in seeking necessary adjustments to the YKSD and YFSD REAA boundaries so that Rampart can become a permanent part of YKSD.
- 9. This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect until the boundary change discussed in item 8 above is implemented, whether administratively or legislatively. This agreement shall automatically terminate on the effective date of such boundary change. If the boundary change is proposed legislatively and fails to pass the Legislature, this Agreement shall terminate on June 30 of the fiscal year in which the failure to pass such legislation occurred.

The parties further agree to work cooperatively in the best interests of the students of Rampart School to continue to implement this agreement in an expeditious manner.
