FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 309

Analysis

This bill would add an exemption for campaign disclosure reporting for smaller groups who collect and spend \$2,500 or less per calendar year. It also removes the electronic filing requirement for such groups. A similar exemption currently exists for state judicial retention and municipal candidates.

Additionally the bill would exempt municipal officers and candidates, in municipalities and borough with populations of 15,000 or less, from public official financial disclosure reporting requirements.
