## A BILL

## FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

"An Act relating to eligibility for the permanent fund dividend; and providing for an effective date."

## **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

\* Section 1. AS 43.23.005(a) is amended to read:

(a) An individual is eligible to receive one permanent fund dividend each year in an amount to be determined under AS 43.23.025 if the individual

(1) applies to the department;

(2) is a state resident on the date of application;

(3) was a state resident during the entire qualifying year;

(4) has been physically present in the state for at least <u>168</u> [72] consecutive hours [AT SOME TIME] during the [PRIOR] two years before the current dividend year, regardless of whether the individual is claiming an absence under AS 43.23.008;

(5) is
