STATE OF ALASKA 2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. CSHB 132

Analysis

This bill encourages collaboration between the Departments of Education and Early Development (DEED) and Labor and Workforce Development, and the University of Alaska Board of Regents, to provide financial and technical support to school districts and postsecondary institutions towards the creation or expansion of school to apprenticeship programs or concurrent secondary education and apprenticeship programs for students in Alaska. DEED currently works in collaboration with school districts to increase career, technical, and culturally relevant education to meet student and workforce needs.

The bill establishes a tax credit for businesses who hire, employ, and train registered apprenticeship participants.

It also provides expectations for contracts between school districts and industry partners to provide work-based learning opportunities to students. This includes agreements regarding program descriptions, number of students served, qualifications of instructors, credit opportunities, and program policies and procedures. It instructs DEED to compile a list of work-based learning projects occurring in districts and post them on the department's website and make the list available to districts. The bill also outlines enrollment requirements and a description of the required program components, including instructor certification.

The bill updates requirements for the supervision of children working in a family owned business, as well as changing the minimum age for students who are not working in a family business. The bill sets the time and number of hours of school attendance and employment a student isn't allowed to exceed in one day.

The effective	date is July	1. 2022	(FY2023).

There is no fiscal impact to the Department of Education & Early Development under this bill.
