

Federal fund matching: The US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) received an allocation of \$250,000,000 in the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) for construction of Phase 1, often referred to as the "West Causeway Extension" for the Port of Nome. As implementation proceeds, the Corps and the City of Nome will enter a project partnership agreement which defines the responsibilities of the Corps as the non-Federal sponsor. After execution of the agreement and prior to advertising the contract, the Corps will need to receive the non-Federal share for Phase I which would be \$83.3 million. In addition, the project will also require funds for any moorage, utility, road, or other features which would be constructed under the contract for Phase 1. The most current estimate for this is projected to cost \$92 million. As previously mentioned, federal regulation requires any non-federal funds to be made available prior to advertising of contracts, therefore this projects required matching funds in the amount of \$175.3 million before February 2023, otherwise the project loses it's federal funding.
