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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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Analysis

This legislation would permit any physician, physician assistant, practical nurse, registered nurse, and advanced practice registered nurse duly authorized in another jurisdiction to fully practice their profession in Alaska via telehealth, with the exception that they may not prescribe controlled substances. These practitioners would not be required to hold an Alaska license.
The Division of Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing does not anticipate any additional expenditures as a result of this legislation; regulation changes will be included in existing projects. However, the division has no way of quantifying the loss in revenue to the affected programs as a result of this legislation.
Professional licensing programs within the Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing are funded by Receipt Supported Services, fund source 1156 Rcpt Svcs (DGF). Licensing fees for each occupation are set per AS 08.01.065 so the total amount of revenue collected approximately equals the occupation's actual regulatory costs.

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
